In Maths, we are carrying on with our counting and ordering numbers and also finding the missing numbers on the number line. We will be embedding the new vocabulary we are learning, including greater than, less than, more than, fewer than, the same as and is equal to. In Music, we will enjoy clapping and playing in time to the music, as well as singing and clapping our names and also our friend's name. We will be working on our mouse control skills and using the Chromebooks in Computing. Year 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Maths we will be continuing to learn to count in 2's, 5's and 10's. We will also be starting to look at counting in 3's. In English we will be starting to look at a new traditional tale of 'Little Red Reading Hood!'. In Science, we will be investigating the properties of translucent, opaque and transparent materials. Year 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Maths we are starting a new learning unit based on addition and subtraction using 1s, 10s, and 100s. We use small steps to build confidence and fluency. In PE, we will be continuing with our dance routines by rehearsing an 8-step dance to country music. We will be moving to our next new text in Book club, focusing on a non-fiction text about Sophie Christianson. Year 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Our maths focus is rounding and we will be working on rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000. In English, we will finish our Feast story and will begin our learning about non-chronological reports by identifying and exploring key features of the text type. In history, we will be looking at the evidence found at Sutton Hoo and what it tells us about Anglo-Saxon life.
